These Scholarships are by nomination and recommendation only. Please read carefully. ALBERT ALI SPORTS AWARDS: Given annually to outstanding N.U. male and female student athletes. NEVADA UNION ONLY – (Now part of the District Scholarship Application)

AMERICAN LEGION BASEBALL SCHOLARSHIP: Any Team Manager or Head Coach of an American Legion (Post – affiliated) team may nominate one player for consideration. The scholarship application, three letters of testimony (Legion Coach or Team Manager/American Legion Post Commander or Adjutant/Scout or Church Leader or Principal) must be attached to the nomination form. The scholarship may be used to attend a school selected by the student providing it is state accredited and above the high school level. Must be high school graduate, be on a roster (American Legion National Baseball Electronic registration form), and be a part of a team affiliated with an American Legion Post.

AMERICAN SOCIETY OF MECHANICAL ENGINEERS - AUXILIARY LUCY AND CHARLES W. E. CLARKE SCHOLARSHIP: For high school graduating seniors whose FIRST FTC or FRC team experience has inspired them to pursue a major in mechanical engineering. Must be nominated by an ASME or ASME Auxiliary member, or active FIRST student member. Need based. ASSOCIATED STUDENT BODY SCHOLARSHIP: Varied amount and number. Selected by Student Activities Director. NEVADA UNION ONLY

BARRON, GLORIA PRIZE FOR YOUNG HEROES SCHOLARSHIP: Nominees, who may range in age from 8 to 18 years old, must have been the prime mover of an inspiring service project and made a significant positive impact on people, their communities, and the environment (currently working on this project or having done so within the past 12 months). demonstrated positive spirit and high moral purpose in accomplishing their goals. Nominees must include a letter from the Lead Reference, an adult advocate who has solid knowledge of the applicant's heroic activities (i.e. be nominated by responsible adults who have solid knowledge of the young person's heroic activities, and who are not related to the nominee). This could be a teacher, librarian, school counselor, youth services official, and religious leaders. Winners of the Barron Prize receive \$5,000 to be applied to their higher education or to their service project. <http://www.barronprize.org/> **Due April 15**

BELK, JOHN MONTGOMERY SCHOLARSHIP (DAVIDSON COLLEGE, NORTH CAROLINA) Demonstrated intellectual & personal success, significant leadership in high school, and plan on attending Davidson College. (Counselors or principals may nominate only 1 or 2 per school) Scholarship provides comprehensive funding (tuition, fees, room and board), plus special study stipends that allow you great flexibility in the on- and off-campus opportunities you choose to explore. BOSTON UNIVERSITY TRUSTEE SCHOLARSHIP: Top 5-10%, perfect 4.0 gpa, SAT 1400 Most prestigious full-tuition scholarship renewable for 4 years recognizes outstanding academic performance and leadership ability. Recipients are typically intellectually and creatively adventurous and demonstrate viewpoints, experiences or achievements beyond the usual. BRATTON, MICHAEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: Selected by NU football coaches. **Nevada Union Only**

CALIFORNIA ASSOCIATION OF LATINO SUPERINTENDENTS AND ADMINISTRATORS (CALSA'S) SCHOLARSHIP: \$1,000 scholarships for Latina/Latino students to use during the upcoming academic year at a college or university of the students choice. Graduating high school students must complete a formal application to qualify for

CIF SAC-JOQUIN, LACKY SCHOLAR ATHLETE: Awarded on the basis of exemplary academic and athletic careers. Must be a graduating senior, have participated in a varsity sport in the Sac-Joaquin Section for two years AND have a record of good citizenship. Must possess a 3.7 unweighted gpa and have scored a minimum of 1350 on SAT (three components) or 19 on the ACT (two components). Selected by Athletic and academic committee. **Due March**

COMCAST LEADERS AND ACHIEVERS AWARD: Open to high school seniors with a minimum 2.8 gpa, demonstrated leadership abilities in school activities or through work experiences, strong commitment to community service involvement, Student may be planning on attending an accredited nonprofit college, university, or vocational/technical school in the United States. **Due December**

CSF (CALIFORNIA SCHOLARSHIP FEDERATION) CHARLES AND MARIAN SEYMOUR AWARD: Each spring, regional committees choose fifty outstanding Life Members from among candidates nominated by their chapter advisers. This process includes an application, essay, letters of recommendation, and an interview. The final selection is made on the basis of character, leadership, and service. Each of the 50 will receive a \$2,000 Scholarship. After interviews, one from each of the five regions is selected as the Seymour Regional Award Winner and will receive an additional \$3,000. DANFORTH SCHOLARS PROGRAM @ WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY (ST. LOUIS, MO.): Student with integrity, selflessness, commitment to community, and embraces high ideals (Counselor must nominate you). May receive a full or partial tuition scholarship renewable for 4 years. DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION GOOD CITIZENS AWARD: Open to senior boy or girl who has an interest in American History and government. Students nominated by the school faculty. Finalists must complete an essay, from which a winner is selected. **Due November**

DISABLED AMERICAN VETERANS JESSE BROWN SCHOLARSHIP: Open to any volunteer who is age 21 or younger and has volunteered a minimum of 100 hours at a VA medical center. Volunteer hours can accumulate over time and must be credited to the Disabled American Veterans. Hours accumulated under the DAV's Local Veterans Assistance Program are also eligible for consideration. Student may be planning on attending a university, college, community college, vocational school. Nominations for this award may be submitted by the Voluntary Service Program Manager at the VA Medical Center, DAV Department Commander, or the student may complete the self-nomination. Top award is \$20,000. Additional scholarships are awarded in the amounts of \$15,000, \$10,000, \$7,500 & \$5,000. GATES MILLENNIUM SCHOLARSHIP: 3.3 GPA Gates Millennium Scholars Program selects 1,000 talented students annually to receive a good-through-graduation scholarship to use at any college or university of their choice. Open to outstanding African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian Pacific Islander American and Hispanic American students with high academic promise and demonstrated leadership abilities through participation in community service, extracurricular or other activities and who have significant financial need (Meet the Federal Pell Grant eligibility criteria). GE-REAGAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARS PROGRAM: For seniors who demonstrate exemplary leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship at school, home, in the workplace, and in the community. Must be nominated by an eligible community leader (H.S. principal, elected official, or executive director of a nonprofit). GONZAGA UNIVERSITY IGNATIAN LEADERS SCHOLARSHIP: Ignatian Leaders Scholarship rewards and helps to develop the Ignatian style of servant leadership. Criteria for nomination and self-nomination include min 3.5 gpa, at least 2 years of demonstrated leadership activities and at least 2 years of demonstrated community service activities. Value is \$6,000 per year. For all the above Scholarships, must be recommended for high moral standards, superior GPA, high SAT scores, have financial need, be willing to earn a portion of college expenses, and have a clear idea of college major. **NOTIFY THE SCHOLARSHIP COORDINATOR IF YOU WISH TO BE RECOMMENDED. YOU MUST BE ENROLLED AT THE SCHOOL THAT NOMINATES YOU. DUE MARCH**

OPERATION HOMEFRONT'S MILITARY CHILD OF THE YEAR AWARD: Nominations to recognize an outstanding military child (ages 8-18 years old) from each branch of the service are open. Children of military retirees or deceased military may also apply. Nominations may be made by parents, other family members, teachers, counselors, coaches, community and church leaders, neighbors and others. The winners will be awarded a trip to Washington D.C. along with an adult, \$10,000 cash prize and a laptop computer. Child must be a legal military dependent. Status confirmed by Military ID or DEERS enrollment form. Each of them represents a branch of the armed forces for their scholarship, volunteerism, leadership, extracurricular involvement, and other criteria while facing the challenges of military family life. There is a seventh award for a young person age 13-18. This award is the Military Child of the Year Award for Innovation® presented by Booz Allen Hamilton. STAR SCHOLARSHIP: Must be a female graduating high school senior, Minimum 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale, Exhibit excellence in academics, leadership, extracurricular activities, community service and potential for future success, Must be 20 years of age **or under** by November 30, Is a citizen or legal permanent resident of the United States or Canada, Plans to attend an accredited post-secondary educational institution in the United States or Canada, full-time or part-time in the fall following graduation from high school. Must be recommended by a P.E.O. Chapter. Receive pre-qualifying scholarship applications from the District Scholarship Coordinator **Due November 30**

PRUDENTIAL SPIRIT OF COMMUNITY AWARDS: Awarded to top volunteers in the school or community. Must have participated in a volunteer activity at least in part after September 1 of the year you are nominated. One state winner will receive a \$1,000 scholarship and an all-expense paid trip to D.C. The 5 National honorees each receive a \$5,000 scholarship plus a \$5,000 grant to the nonprofit charitable organization of their choice. Notify the Scholarship Coordinator if you are seeking nomination. **Due November 8**

ROTARY DISTRICT 5190 MATCHING SCHOLARSHIP: Must study within one of these areas of focus: Peace and Conflict Prevention/Resolution, or Economic and Community Development. May be planning on attending any accredited college. The ideal District Scholar candidate: possesses excellent leadership skills and potential, has a proven record of success in his/her academics and/or vocation, is well-groomed and has a professional appearance, has demonstrated a personal commitment to community service, is interested in participating in and possibly identifying Rotary service projects, has well-defined and realistic goals, possesses maturity and seriousness of purpose, is an excellent public speaker, is diplomatic and articulate when discussing world affairs and sensitive topics, has concrete ideas as to how he/she will improve international understanding and world peace, has thoroughly researched his/her preferred study institution, is interested in a study field that has a direct impact on the humanitarian needs of the world, is flexible and possesses a good sense of humor. **Potential for \$4,000 Scholarship** Please see Barbara Ross for more details **asap**.

SALCEDO, JOHN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: Selected by NU football coaches. **Nevada Union Only**

SEATTLE UNIVERSITY'S SULLIVAN LEADERSHIP AWARDS: Minimum 3.7 GPA, Open to CA. H.S. seniors who plan on attending Seattle University committed to academic excellence, service and leadership, community, spirituality, global engagement and possess well-developed written and oral communication skills. The scholarship covers tuition, room and board for each of the four years and is awarded to nine incoming first-year students each year. <https://www.seattleu.edu/sullivan/> **Due November 15**

TIKKUN OLAM (DILLER TEEN) AWARD: California Jewish teens between 13-19 years of age are eligible to win one of 5 \$36,000 awards, which may be used to further their education or to further their community service. The award is for the self-identifying Jewish teen that has demonstrated remarkable leadership and is actively engaged in projects which embody the spirit of tikkun olam (repair of the world). Student may submit an application without a nomination (however, a 3rd recommendation is required in this case) or be nominated by a teacher, rabbi, community leader, or individual who knows the value of your volunteer service. UNITED STATES SENATE YOUTH PROGRAM (SYP): Sponsored by the William Randolph Hearst Foundation. Good GPA, school and community activities to include currently serving in an elected student body office, demonstrate knowledge of state and national government, essay on a topic of national or historical importance. 104 - \$10,000 scholarships and one-week internship to Washington, D. C. for indoctrination into the functions of government. Must hold an elected office (ASB President, V-P, Secretary or Treasurer; Class President, V-P, Secretary or Treasurer; Student Council

Representative; Student Representative Elected or Appointed to the School Board, or a district, regional or state-level civic or educational organization). (Request your teacher consider you for nomination) **Due October 1st**

UNIVERSITY OF DAYTON SCHOLARSHIP BY NOMINATION: (A top 10 national Catholic university). Each high school has the opportunity to nominate one student for the Leadership in Service Scholarship, a scholarship worth \$10,000 (\$2,500 per year for four years). Must meet admission standards, the scholarship does not need to be based upon GPA and test scores. This is for the student who has an innate desire for personal development and committed to service within his or her school, church or community. Currently 350 students from 36 states are enrolled at the University of Dayton through this program. (FYU, students who visit the University of Dayton campus and file their FAFSA prior to March 1 will receive free textbooks for four years, up to \$500 per semester worth up to \$4,000 over 4 years, upon enrollment). WENDY H. S. HEISMAN PROGRAM: Student athletes may nominate themselves for this. Potential to win a Wendy's gift card worth at least \$10 or a scholarship between \$1,000 and \$10,000. For students who exhibit excellence in the classroom, have at least a 3.0 gpa, and participate in at least one school sponsored sport. You must have a staff person/coach review/verify your application, so apply early for this award/scholarship opportunity.
