- I. 51225.1. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, a school district shall exempt a homeless pupil as defined by the McKinney-Vento Act as in Section 11434a(2) of Title 42 of the United States Code, who transfers between schools any time after the completion of the pupil's second year of high school from all coursework and other requirements adopted by the governing board of the school district that are in addition to the statewide coursework requirements specified in Section 51225.3, unless the school district makes a finding that the pupil is reasonably able to complete the school district's graduation requirements in time to graduate from high school by the end of the pupil's fourth year of high school.

- II. (b) If the school district determines that the pupil in a homeless situation is reasonably able to complete the school district's graduation requirements within the pupil's fifth year of high school, the district shall do all of the following:
- 1) Inform the pupil of his or her option to remain in school for a fifth year to complete the school district's graduation requirements.
  - 2) Inform the pupil, and the person holding the right to make educational decisions for the pupil, about how remaining in school for a fifth year to complete the school district's graduation requirements will affect the pupil's ability to gain admission to a postsecondary educational institution.
  - 3) Provide information to the pupil about transfer opportunities available through the California Community Colleges.
  - 4) Permit the pupil to stay in school for a fifth year to complete the school district's graduation requirements upon agreement with the pupil, if the pupil is 18 years of age or older, or, if the pupil is under 18 years of age, upon agreement with the person holding the right to make educational decisions for the pupil.

(f) If a pupil in a homeless situation is exempted from local graduation requirements pursuant to this section, the school district shall notify the pupil and the person holding the right to make educational decisions for the pupil how any of the requirements that are waived will affect the pupil's ability to gain admission to a postsecondary educational institution and shall provide information about transfer opportunities available through the California Community Colleges.

**IV. Courses required to graduate under AB 1806**

51225.3. (a) A pupil shall complete all of the following while in grades 9 to 12, inclusive, in order to receive a diploma from high school:

- 1) At least the following numbers of courses in the subjects specified, each course having a duration of one year, unless otherwise specified:
  - (A) Three courses in English
  - (B) Two courses in mathematics
  - (C) Two courses in science, including biological and physical sciences.
  - (D) Three courses in social studies, including United States history and geography; world history, culture, and geography; a one-semester course in American government and civics; and a one-semester course in economics
  - (E) One course in visual or performing arts, foreign language, or, commencing with the 2012-2013 school year, career technical education.
  - (F) Two courses in physical education, unless the pupil has been exempted pursuant to the provisions of this code.
