Auburn Aviation Association 2018 Student Pilot Scholarship Program Ground School and Flight Training

The Auburn Aviation Association has made two (2) \$2500.00 scholarships available to expose Auburn area students to the exciting world of general aviation. Recipients of the award will receive paid ground school and flight training. \$2500 is the maximum monetary amount awarded to each student for practical flight training and flight school regardless of the student's ability to complete the program in the time allotted. Any additional instruction cost will be incurred by the student, their family, or support group. **Please note: this scholarship program is not intended to fulfill academic requirements for high school graduation. Please read all the rules below.**

All decisions are final and not transferable.

- 1. The applicant must be a legal citizen of the United States.
- 2. Must be a registered student or a home study student in Auburn or surrounding area.
- 3. Must be sixteen (16) years of age and no older than 22 by March 1, 2018.
- 4. Must write and submit a <u>short</u> essay on "what becoming a pilot would mean to me" and why you should be a scholarship recipient. This essay will be accompanied by responses to the enclosed questionnaire. This essay and questionnaire should be no longer than one page each, type written.
- 5. If under the age of 18, you must include with essay and questionnaire written permission from your parent or legal guardian. Your parent or guardian must also provide their address and telephone number.
- 6. Must have a third class medical certificate.
- 7. Entries must be postmarked by March 30, 2018. Mail entries to: Auburn Aviation Association, Attn: Walt Wilson, Pilot Scholarship Program, P.O. Box 6454, Auburn, CA 95604.
- 8. Must be able to interview at Auburn Municipal Airport on Saturday, April 21, 2018 (another interview session at a later date will be determined if necessary).
- 9. Must be able to attend ground school in the spring at Auburn Municipal Airport. Ground school is a ten-week course, one day per week. Scholarship recipients shall be expected to finish the scholarship portion of their flight training one year after starting ground school.
- 10. These scholarships are also available to students who have already passed the F.A.A. written ground school exam and/or have a pilot's license, and are actively pursuing an education in the aviation industry. In that case, the \$2500 would be used to further flight education requirements.
