## California Department of Public Health Covid- 19 Exposure Guide for Schools

- This exposure guide defines follow up guidelines if a staff/student experiences one of the following scenarios:
  - 1. One or more symptoms of Covid-19
  - 2. Close contact with a person who is positive for Covid-19
  - 3. A positive Covid- 19 test
  - 4. A negative test after experiencing symptoms
- These guidelines require collaboration with the NJUHSD school nurses and the Nevada County Department of Public Health to ensure a safe return to work/school
- 1. SCENARIO ONE: Staff/Student experiences one or more of the symptoms of Covid-19
  - a. STAY HOME OR GO HOME.
  - b. **CONTACT THE SCHOOL HEALTH OFFICE**: The Health Office will initiate a Covid–19 screening to determine follow-up to receive appropriate medical care and satisfy return to work/school requirements. This screening form will be maintained in a confidential file in the health office and updated as needed.
  - c. The School Nurse will review the following options with the staff member or student's parent/guardian for returning to school or work: (These guidelines are also printed on the back of the Symptom Check list)
    - a. If the staff/student answered YES to one or more of the Daily Symptom Check questions and they followed up with a Covid-19 test that had a negative result, then they may return to work/school when the following conditions are met:
      - i. Symptoms are resolving (not necessarily completely resolved)
      - ii. Fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications
      - iii. 24 hours without an incidence of diarrhea
      - iv. Submission to school of negative Covid-19 test
      - v. Clearance from the NJUHSD nurse has been received
    - b. If the staff/student answered YES to one or more of the Daily Symptom Check questions and they followed up with a Covid- 19 test that had a positive result, then they may return to work/school when the following conditions are met:
      - i. It has been 10 days since the onset of symptoms
      - ii. Symptoms are resolving (not necessarily resolved)
      - iii. Fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications
      - iv. 24 hours without an incidence of diarrhea
      - v. Clearance from the NJUHSD nurse has been received
    - c. If the staff/student answered YES to one or more of the Daily Symptom Check questions and they have not had a Covid-19 test, then they should consult their healthcare provider who will decide if they are a candidate for Covid-19 testing
      - i. If the physician recommends testing, then depending on the result of the test, see option 'a' or 'b' above.
      - ii. If testing is not recommended by their healthcare provider, then staff/student may return to work/school when the following conditions are met:
        - 1. Symptoms are resolving (not necessarily completely resolved)
        - 2. Fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications
        - 3. 24 hours without an incidence of diarrhea
        - 4. Submission to school of physician note stating the Covid-19 test not needed

- 5. Clearance from the NJUHSD nurse has been received
- d. If the staff/student answered YES to one or more of the Daily Symptom Check questions and they have not had a Covid test and have chosen not to contact their healthcare provider, then they may return to work/school when the following conditions are met:
  - i. It has been 10 days since the onset of symptoms
  - ii. Symptoms are resolving (not necessarily resolved)
  - iii. Fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications
  - iv. 24 hours without an incidence of diarrhea
  - v. Clearance from the NJUHSD nurse has been received
- 2. SCENARIO TWO: Staff/student has been in close contact with a person who is positive for Covid- 19. (A close contact is defined as an individual who was within 6 feet of an infected person for at least 15 minutes)
  - a. **STAY HOME**
  - b. **CALL THE SCHOOL HEALTH OFFICE**: The School Nurse will help determine whether you were a close contact and then determine the necessary follow up
  - c. If the staff/student does not develop symptoms of Covid- 19 then:
    - i. Send home to quarantine for 10 days from last exposure to confirmed Covid positive case- Give NCPHD Handout: <u>Home Quarantine Guidance for Close</u> Contacts to Coronavirus Disease 2019
    - ii. Recommend Covid- 19 Test (but will not shorten 10-day guarantine)
  - d. If staff/student meets criteria for a close contact and develops symptoms of Covid-19 then:
    - i. Home Isolation: Give NCPHD Handout Home Care Instructions for People with Respiratory Symptoms
    - ii. Recommend physician visit and/or Covid- 19 Test
    - iii. Anticipated date of return to work/school is when the following criteria are met:
      - 1. 10 days after symptoms first appeared AND
      - 2. Your fever is gone for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications AND
      - 3. Your other symptoms (e.g. cough, shortness of breath, aches, sore throat, etc.) are improving
      - 4. Clearance from the NJUHSD nurse has been received
  - e. Report case to school administration for consideration of school community notification of a known contact
- 3. SCENARIO THREE: Staff/student tests positive for Covid-19
  - a. **STAY HOME** on Isolation Give NCPHD Handout: <u>Home Care Instructions for People with Respiratory Symptoms</u>
  - b. **CONTACT THE SCHOOL HEALTH OFFICE**: The school nurse will guide the student and staff through the Public Health guidelines for a safe return to school
  - c. Nevada County Public Health Department will be notified by your school nurse or trained school personnel
  - d. The school nurse and Nevada County Public Health will work with the student or staff member to identify contacts
  - e. Disinfection and cleaning of classroom and primary spaces where case spent significant time
  - f. Report case to administration for consideration of school community notification of a known case
  - g. May return to work/ school when following criteria met:

- i. If symptoms occurred:
  - 1. 10 days after symptoms first appeared AND
  - 2. Your fever is gone for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications AND your other symptoms (e.g. cough, shortness of breath) have improved
  - 3. Clearance from the NJUHSD nurse has been received
- ii. If no symptoms occurred:
  - 1. 10 days after the Covid- 19 test was performed. Example: Date of collection 6/11, positive, never had symptoms. Day 1 of 10 days starts on 6/12, return to school on 6/22
  - 2. Clearance from the NJUHSD nurse has been received
- **4. SCENARIO FOUR: Staff/student tests negative after symptoms:** May return to work/school when following criteria met:
  - a. Symptoms are resolving (not necessarily completely resolved)
  - b. Fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications
  - c. 24 hours without an incidence of diarrhea
  - d. Submission to school of negative Covid-19 test
  - e. Clearance from the NJUHSD nurse has been received
- 5. Staff/students who meet the criteria for the above scenarios should continue to do the following while in quarantine or isolation:
  - a. Continue to use daily Covid-19 self-screening tool
  - b. Advised to contact physician if symptoms worse
  - c. Advised to call 911 or go to an emergency room, if having difficulty breathing, feeling pain or pressure in chest, bluish lips/face, or are experiencing a new onset of confusion or difficulty waking up
  - d. Let your doctor know if you are 65 years or older and/or have health problems such as a chronic disease or a weak immune system as you may be at higher risk of more serious illness.
